



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A Special Letter from Ethan Curtis

A story of how it all began, how it all went, and how it all might continue.

My name is Ethan Curtis. I am the young man who started the Veracity Revival, a website and movement to light the Church in America on fire.

The Veracity Revival website was officially launched in February of 2018, a year after I had launched my first website, Films4Christ.com (which is no longer active, but you can read the reviews on the Veracity Revival website). After a year of occasionally writing movie reviews that garnered almost 3,000 page views, I felt the LORD leading me in another direction. I worked on the concept, the purpose, and prayed a lot... especially on what to name the website! I was originally going to name it "Mountains Rise Ministries," and even designed a shirt for it,

but somewhere along the line that name was dropped. I randomly, actually providentially stumbled upon the word "veracity" in the dictionary, and instantly fell in love with one of it's definitions: "devotion to the truth." I tried out different names, varying from "Veracity Impact" to "Veracity Action" to simply "Veracity", back to "Mountains Rise", and then onto really weird combinations of words such as "Verafactment" and "Raverlution." I can't even remember what those stood for. " I decided to take a step of faith and wait for the LORD to show me what I should name the website instead of choosing one myself. Then, within a couple days a name struck me in such a way that I knew it had come from the LORD. It came out of nowhere like a lightning bolt from a clear sky. It perfectly summed up what I wanted this website to be about. It incorporated the word I "accidentally" found in the dictionary and another word full of passion and meaning. The name was "Veracity Revival," and using the definition of "veracity" I chose, it means "Devotion to the Truth - REVIVAL" Before I completed the recent updates to the website, those very words would greet you on the homepage. Also in February, my friend Keleigha Liess joined the writing team with the article "Choose Life." Since the website's launch, we have written and published over 40 articles, for a total of over 50 (the nine articles I wrote on the Films4Christ blog were carried over). And in November we revealed our new logo, created by Meeka Harding. In the beginning of the Veracity Revival website, especially during the early days when I trusted

the LORD to give me the name for the website and really waited on Him for everything, I was passionate about what I wrote, and I knew what the LORD wanted me to write. At that time I believe that I was very surrendered to Him and really did have a humble heart. But somewhere along the way I fear that I slid off course ever so slightly. I believe that it is the duty of the Church to fight against abortion and save children from it like the Bible commands and like the early Church in Rome did. But somewhere along the way my passion turned into anger with those who disagreed with me. I began writing my articles to attack those whom I disagreed with instead of humbly calling them to the truth. I lost sight of who the real enemy was... Satan. Ironically, I have written a script for a graphic novel called "The Real Enemy." Perhaps the saddest thing of all is that over time I began relying less on Christ for my inspiration and motivation and more so on myself and the conflicts with others to drive me forward. I knew I was right in most of the arguments and debates that I had been involved in (and I say that humbly), but I did not guard myself against pride. And when one lets

pride into his heart, it is one tough giant to slay. As I write this I feel much remorse, but writing this brings me much hope. I feel that acknowledging past mistakes is the only way to move forward. As I once heard a pastor say, we must return to the place we got off track in order to make progress. My friend, do not attempt to press forward to higher ground when you deserted the path to it long ago. Go back and find the path. I have created this magazine and sent it to you for several reasons. One is to thank the awesome people who are subscribed and follow my website. This is my (late!) Christmas gift to you! Originally that was my only intention. But now as I write these words I begin to understand that the Lord had bigger plans. I didn't plan on writing everything I just did. It sorta just happened. Secondly, I want this magazine to bring glory to God, and I really mean that. Thirdly, I want to acknowledge my mistakes and ask for forgiveness. I don't know how much my frustration actually came through, but I sincerely desire to return to the original purpose and God-dependent model of the website. I am going to write articles that lift up His name for the world to see. And fourthly, I want to tell

you my hopes and and dreams for 2019, which is turning the Veracity Revival into more than just a website. When I originally started the website I envisioned local prayer groups that would meet regularly to pray, fellowship, and discuss how they could impact their local communities and churches. I envisioned creating materials to reach complacent churches and the lost world. I have many dreams, and I am very excited to see what the LORD will bring about in 2019. I want to seek His will first, not mine. I ask you to pray with me that the LORD will bring REVIVAL to America; that HE will set our hearts on fire for HIM and HIS kingdom, in turn setting our Churches on fire, in turn setting our land on fire. Let's tear down the strongholds of the enemy, and proclaim our God to be God over all. It is high time for REVIVAL.

The Destructiveness of Christian Pacifism

This is a classic article originally published on Films4Christ.com, that was republished on VeracityRevival (on January 26). I consider this article one of the best I have ever written. As a note, I am writing about the kind of pacifism I now call "cultural pacifism." I pray this article is a blessing to you!

Pacifism. Staying silent when one should speak out.

It seems popular these days among **Christians**, and hence, it is no wonder that America is falling apart. I'm not talking about pacifists who don't believe in killing, (Although that is also a very sad and harmful mindset), I'm talking about cultural pacifists who don't speak out, who don't stand. **Anti-activists.**

Let me give a couple examples to clarify: A Christian who believes protesting (e.g. against **abortion**) is wrong. A Christian who claims to follow Christ, but is unwilling to put him/herself in a position to be a light to the world. Someone who would rather "get along" with others than speak the **truth**, and possibly offend them. Actually, they take time to tell others how their methods of opposing evil are wrong instead of opposing it **themselves.**

There are several reasons why this mindset is not only **anti-Biblical** but destructive. First, the assumption that Christians should not be activists and should try to be nice little harmless citizens is a **wild** idea that does not come from the Bible and is an idea that contradicts the historical picture of what Christians look like.



Examples from the **Bible**: I once heard a sermon where the speaker was very fired up. He claimed that Christians should not be activists because "Jesus was not an activist". If Jesus wasn't an activist, then what do you call a man who runs around from city to city, insulting Pharisees, upsetting the masses, and eventually getting nailed to a cross? Besides, Jesus wasn't many things during His time on earth that we are. Furthermore, saying Christians should only be concerned with preaching the simple Gospel doesn't make sense when you realize that even **Jesus himself** didn't just preach the message of salvation. Read through the Gospels and pay attention to how much of what Jesus says is only the salvation message. He preached life lessons on how to live, he took time to heal the

hurting. The **Gospel** is much more than the message of salvation!

And consider **Paul**, one of the most famous authors in Christian history. How much of Paul's teachings were "simply Gospel"? At Athens, Paul started with where the people were and **led them** to the Gospel. He didn't just jump in and start preaching that they were going to hell when they died. I'm simply stating plain Biblical concepts. Paul's letters were not simple, in fact they were so theologically dense at times that many Christians are still divided over what he meant.

I do wholeheartedly agree that the Gospel of Jesus Christ is the most important thing we can possibly share and that we must share it if we are to live out the Great Commission. (Matt. 28:19). But we can not simply ignore other

issues that we as **Christians** are called to deal with. God has made a life for Christians to live that is so vast, exciting, and revolutionary that we can miss what God has for us by becoming **legalistic** about our faith and preaching.

Christianity can't be confined to a box.

This sums it up: "You are the light of the world. **A city set on a hill can not be hidden.**" (Matt. 5:14, ESV). When Christians live their lives wanting to be quiet little obedient citizens and the government's pets who won't stand for the truth and put themselves on the firing line, they are basically trying to hide the city for whatever reason. I can't judge them, because I can't see their **hearts**. But whether it be due to cowardice or a misunderstanding of the Scriptures, it is my duty to speak

the truth out of love, and as the tag-line for Ray Comfort's Audacity movie puts it: **Love Can't Stay Silent.**

Whether you attend a rally or share your faith on the street, **activism** is a **public testimony** of your faith and what you stand for. It's taking off the mask, not caring what others think about you, and simply doing what you know is right. You may be afraid, but **God** will be your strength. You may get hate mail and words and be persecuted, but hey, "Blessed are those who are persecuted for **righteousness' sake**, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven". (Matt. 5:10 ESV). It's time to stop thinking like **Americans**, ("Life should be a breeze. Who wants conflict?"), and start thinking like **Christians**, ("Life is a battle. Satan's on the warpath. I'm going to get shot at").

Take a look at Christian history. The Church grew exponentially. Did it do that by obeying the government and keeping their mouths shut? Or did it accomplish the impossible by running, hiding, adapting, and conquering? Where in the world did the idea of **cultural pacifism** come from??? The early Church Christians **tore down** the infanticide shrines in Rome, they



rescued deserted children.

Many Christians admire the heroes of the faith who stood, fought, and died for truth. They **didn't stay silent** when the rulers said "enough." They kept running, preaching, and living out their faith. It cost them their lives. Many of these admirers would never speak out against **injustice**.

Is it right to keep silent when countless babies are being **slaughtered**? In the same sermon I mentioned above, the speaker said that he was against abortion, but wouldn't go to a rally against it, because that would be wrong.

Really??? Where in the Bible does it say, "Even if it's wrong, and you can do something about it, just shut up"?

Reading through the Old Testament this year, I noticed a **surprising** amount of verses focusing on **upholding justice** and **defending** those who can not defend themselves. Take Proverbs 31:8 for example. Depending on the exact wording of your translation, it basically says to speak out for those who can't. And how about the story of the Good Samaritan? (Luke 10:30-37). No one else would help the man. But the Samaritan was willing to do what no one else would. **Whatever happened to**

standing for truth and justice?

Throughout almost all Church history, it has been persecuted. In America, we have had the unique opportunity of freedom of speech and religion.

We're losing it fast. We have had an opportunity to reach the world like never before, to live out our faith everywhere. But Christians have become **complacent**. The opportunity has largely been **wasted**.

You can look around and point fingers at who's fault it is that America is crumbling. But if you're a Christian, you don't have to look far. Look in the **mirror**. Yeah, that's the one. If Christians had stood for what is right, fought the good fight, got involved like they should have... Things may very well be different. Want me to prove it? Okay.

What happens when light and darkness face off? The darkness is defeated. The Church throughout history has been on the offensive, taking down mental and philosophical strongholds (as Paul **commanded**), conquering the tactics of the Prince of Darkness. Saul tried to stop them. He joined them. Rome did too. On and on. Christians always win when they fight. Sure, there seems to be times when the fire has been quenched.

But then it starts again, even **stronger** than last time. The Church of Christ is unstoppable. That's because it serves an **unstoppable God**.

About Germany. **Hitler** used the "obey the government" verses to convince Christians that they should just submit to him. Many did. Look what happened. The courageous few who did stand (Like **Corrie ten Boom**), made their mark. They saved human lives. Lots of lives. Because they weren't afraid to stand for the truth no matter what rulers said. Corrie ten Boom is admired by many for her courage. She lied, stole, and most certainly disobeyed the government to save human lives. Many if not most of her admirers would **never** do the same.

In fact, let's take a brief look at some of those passages. Hebrews 13:17: It says to submit because the leaders are *watching over your souls*. In Romans 13, (A favorite of the pacifist crowd) Paul says quite plainly to submit or else you resist God... Right? Actually, it gives a **reason** for submitting. "For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, *but to bad*". And "Then do what is good, and *you will receive his approval*." But if I submit to Hitler, wouldn't that would be the opposite

of doing what is good? If I submit to him, I would have to break other Biblical principles. If I "do what is good," I certainly won't "receive his approval". Hitler didn't "watch over people's souls". Hitler wasn't a "terror to evil". **Judge for yourself**. Is it right to stay silent when you could make an **impact**?

And back to the issue of why America is crumbling. Christians didn't stand for **truth**. Oh, some certainly did and still are. But not enough. There has been a widespread complacency throughout the Church. It happens when Christians are so worldly that the "salt has lost its flavor". It happens when Christians are too "refined" to get their hands dirty helping someone. It comes when Christians become pacifists. They think that Christianity is a matter of personal truth and comfort instead of a **revolution against the kingdom of darkness**.

Anyone who has read a fair amount of **Medieval** history (which I find fascinating) must know that many castle sieges ended when someone in the castle let the enemy in **without a fight**. It's called being a traitor, and while I won't call Christian pacifists that, they must realize how deadly their mindset is to everyone else.

When Christians **withdraw** from culture, politics, and their mission becomes to build a fortress around them, (Nancy Pearcey, bestselling author of "Total Truth", calls this the **fortress mentality**), they let the enemy march past and hit those courageous enough to stand. It's akin to eight soldiers retreating to leave the courageous two to fight the enemy alone, even though they could have won. While Christians certainly do not find strength in numbers, but rather God eternal, it has consequences. Am I saying God needs us to do his will? Well... no. because God can do whatever He wants whenever he wants. He's God. But as Paul says, Christ is the head, we are the body. **We are the body**. The head tells the body what to do. The body is **responsible** for doing it. Again I say, God can do anything, any miracle, without us weakling humans. But, you can not deny it, Jesus lived a life of action, and **commanded** His followers to do the same. It's interesting that pacifists point to Jesus' life to support their beliefs, when in fact, His life is completely contradictory to it.

There is a time for **rest** beside still waters. There is a time for **peace** and **healing**. **There is a**


time for action.

When a Christian refuses to speak for those who can't, whether they be babies or the elderly, the poor or the persecuted, he/she is basically saying **they don't mean enough to him/her for the person to put their own life into action.**

Is staying silent what Christ would want us to do? **The answer is no.** It is time to speak out, take our stand. **Pacifism is not an option.**

It comes down to **love**. For our families, children, the unborn... The list is endless. Do you **love**? Because words are most certainly empty and vain. It's **action that shows what we believe**. What do you believe? Stand where everyone else is afraid to. Go the extra mile.




HOPE
